




## NASFAA's SAI Modeling Tool

- Student Aid Index Modeling Tool: Version 9.1 (Tables Adjusted for Inflation)
- Intended for use with 2023-24 student data.
- Updates values for the Income Protection Allowance (IPA), Employment Expense Allowance, Business/Farm Net Worth Adjustment, Asset Protection Allowance (APA), and Contribution from Adjusted Available Income tables based on the Department of Education's final Pell Eligibility and SAI Guide.
- Version 9 was originally posted on January 31 and updated to v9.1 on February 2 to fix a small issue with the employment expense allowance to increase it by \$30.







# Higher Education Act Reauthorization

#### **HEA Reauthorization**

#### Last reauthorization in 2008

Current version of HEA technically expired in 2013

#### House

- House Democrats introduced the *Roadmap to College Student Success* Act in February 2024.
- House Republicans introduced the *College Cost Reduction Act* in January 2024.


#### Senate

- No comprehensive HEA proposal introduced in the Senate during the 116th, 117th, or thus far during 118th.
- Bipartisan support needed to achieve comprehensive reauthorization.





## **Building Blocks to HEA**





#### No HEA Reauthorization....Now What?

In the absence of full reauthorization we see changes through other pieces of legislation and/or budget bills. For example:

- FUTURE Act in 2019
- FAFSA Simplification Act in 2020
- Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021
- Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2022

# 24-25 ISIR Rollout Issue #1 Confirmed by ED (Assets error)

**March 12:** Error in estimated SAIs provided to students for households with 2 income earners and one income is < \$60K where assets were incorrectly not assessed in the SAI

- The FAFSA Processing System was not including all data fields needed to correctly calculate the SAI for dependent students who reported assets which resulted in inaccurate ISIRs
- Estimated around 200k ISIRs affected
- ED will start reprocessing impacted applications shortly after student corrections are made available in the first half of April



# 24-25 ISIR Rollout Issue #2 Confirmed by ED (Tax data field errors)

March 29: Initial analysis shows that fewer than 20% of applications are affected by one of the following issues:

- Some data fields are pulled from a mix of updated and original returns leading to inconsistent tax data.
- Education tax credit data field is inaccurate.
- For manually entered tax information, inaccurate reported values for education tax credits and income taxes paid, due to discrepancies in the instructions.

# We're Not Done Yet! (1<sup>ST</sup> & 2<sup>ND</sup> Issue)

EA: GENERAL-24-29: Update on Tax Data Received from the FA-DDX and Manually Entered Information (Posted April 1, 2024)

- Department and the IRS identified three issues that impact a subset of FAFSA form
- The first and second issues may occur for a subset of applicants and their contributors who successfully have federal tax information (FTI) transferred via the IRS FUTURE Act Direct Data Exchange (FA-DDX)
  - o Education Tax Credits
  - Amended and Updated Tax Return
- Universally Unique Identification Numbers (UUID's) Identifies FAFSA ED does not intend to automatically reprocess
- 80% of previously submitted FAFSA's are not impacted by issues
- ED will reprocess ISIRs when it will lower the SAI (schools can request others to be reprocessed)




# We're Not Done Yet! 3<sup>rd</sup> Issue)

- The third issue impacts a subset of applicants and their contributors who were required to manually enter their income and tax information.
  - Taxes Paid inconsistencies
  - Written instructions for applicants who are manually entering their education tax credits are inconsistent with the data that will be transferred from the IRS through the FA-DDX process.
  - o ED will not consider manually entered data in accordance with the existing FAFSA instructions to be conflicting information that must be resolved.
  - Schools may use their discretion to make corrections to align what was manually entered with the data that is being reported via the FA-DDX if the school determines that such an adjustment benefits the student.

# FY2024: Where Things Stand

- President Biden on March 23, 2024 signed the FY 2024 budget into law to prevent a government shutdown.
- The law:
  - Allocates \$79.1 billion to ED and its programs
    - This is a \$201 million decrease from the FY 2023 enacted level
  - Contains \$24.6 billion for federal student aid programs, which maintains the maximum Pell Grant award at \$7,395 for the 2024-25 award year
  - Provides level funding for Federal Work Study and the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant
    - The Labor-H Appropriations Subcommittee originally proposed to eliminate these programs in its budget proposal released in July 2023

# FVT/GE Reporting Delayed

ELECTRONIC ANNOUNCEMENT ID: GE-24-01: Timeline of Financial Value Transparency and Gainful Employment Reporting Requirements (Published March 29, 2024)

- July 1, 2024 Ability to start reporting FVT/GE data through the National Student Loan Data System (NŠLDS)
- Institutions will have until October 1, 2024 to provide all required reporting
- April (no timeframe) Reporting guide published
- Week of April 1st FSA Knowledge Center updated with GE/FVT Page
- Early April EA describing NSLDS to assist colleges Mid April FSA Webinar on new NSLDS reports
- Late April GE/FVT reports available to institutions
- June/July Reporting guide webinars
- July Institutions provided with draft "completers lists"
- October 1 All required data must be reported to NSLDS
- Early 2025 ED will publish first GE/FVT metrics and notify institutions of failing GE programs
- By July 2026 ED will make it's program information system available (more to come)

# College Cost Transparency Initiative






